Request for Proposals released for Wood Innovation & Design Centre

PRINCE GEORGE – A multi-storey wood building is closer to becoming a reality, as three qualified teams have been shortlisted to participate in the Request for Proposals (RFP) phase of the competition to design and build the Wood Innovation and Design Centre (WIDC).

Seven groups responded to the Request for Qualifications (RFQ). Following evaluation of the responses received, three teams were shortlisted. They are:

- Maple Reinders/Cree
- WIC Design + Build
- PCL Westcoast Constructors 1057 Inc.

The shortlisted respondents will be invited to respond to the RFP and submit proposals to undertake the design and construction of the WIDC. While only three groups could be shortlisted, the three successful design-build teams have the ability to add to their teams where they feel necessary. This may include members of teams that were not selected to move forward for the RFP process.

The innovative wood building will showcase British Columbia's expertise and global reputation as a leader in wood construction and design and engineered wood products. Its construction will catalyze new wood-product development, commercialization and adoption.

Responses to the RFP will be evaluated based on both cost and the level of innovation that their designs demonstrate. The Province is interested in maximizing the potential size and scope of the WIDC, and will consider these factors in its evaluation of proposals.

Once complete, the building will house academic and research programming with the University of Northern British Columbia, as well as office space for industry and potentially provincial use. It will focus on advancing B.C.'s expertise in wood-related products, and it will highlight new and innovative wood building products and techniques.

Construction of the WIDC is expected to start early in 2013, with completion estimated to be completed by fall 2014.

Quick Facts:

- The WIDC will be built on land once occupied by the Prince George Hotel at the corner of George Street and Fifth Avenue.
- The forest sector is a large contributor to government revenues and enables expenditures on essential public services. Today, this sector continues to be an economic engine for British Columbia, contributing more than 30 per cent of the province's gross domestic product and 12.3 per cent of all employment.
- In September 2011, government issued a Request for Expression of Interest (RFEOI) to obtain input from the design and construction industry regarding building design, construction and procurement attributes for the WIDC project. The government received 34 responses to the RFEOI from a wide variety of companies, including B.C.based and international organizations.
- In April 2012, a RFQ was released seeking interest in, and qualifications for, the project from design-build teams. The RFQ closed June 5, 2012 and seven proponent teams responded.
